Charlie in the box was a character whose main misfit is that his name is Charlie instead of Jack. Then there was the cowboy riding an ostrich instead of a horse; the spotted elephant that was white and pink instead of grey; a choo-choo train that had square wheels on the caboose; a water pistol that shoots jelly... and on and on. I know that in 1964 when the movie came out, there were so many questions about these oddities and why they would not have been considered as unique, but nonetheless, they were all deemed misfits because they were outside the norms for society.


