"I'd Like to Teach the World to Sing"

January 18th, 1971, Bill Backer, creative director on the Coca-Cola account for the McCann Erickson advertising agency, was flying to London to meet up with Billy Davis, the music director on the Coca-Cola account, to write radio commercials with two successful British songwriters, Roger Cook and Roger Greenaway, to be recorded by the New Seekers, a popular British singing group. The heavy fog in London forced the plane to land in Shannon, Ireland. Passengers had to remain near the airport in case the fog lifted. Some of them were furious about their accommodations.

By the next day, Backer saw some of the most irate passengers in the airport cafe. Brought together by a common experience, many were now laughing and sharing stories over snacks and bottles of Coca-Cola. Backer wrote of the scene: "In that moment I saw a bottle of Coke in a whole new light... I began to see a bottle of Coca-Cola as more than a drink that refreshed a hundred million people a day in almost every corner of the globe. So, I began to see the familiar words, 'Let's have a Coke,' as more than an invitation to pause for refreshment. They were actually a subtle way of saying, 'Let's keep each other company for a little while.' And I knew they were being said all over the world as I sat there in Ireland. So that was the basic idea: to see Coke not as it was originally designed to be -- a liquid refresher -- but as a tiny bit of commonality between all peoples, a universally liked formula that would help to keep them company for a few minutes."

When he finally arrived in London, Backer told Billy Davis and Roger Cook what he had seen in the airport café. After he expressed his thoughts about buying everybody in the world a Coke, Backer noticed that Davis' initial reaction was not at all what he'd expected and asked him, "Billy, do you have a problem with this idea?" Davis slowly revealed his problem. "Well, if I could do something for everybody in the world, it would not be to buy them a Coke." Backer responded, "What would you do?" "I'd buy everyone a home first and share with them in peace and love," Davis said. Backer said, "Okay, that sounds good. Let's write that and I'll show you how Coke fits right into the concept."

I remember as a very young child watching this commercial and thinking, wow, could it be that easy to bring the world together? Could it truly be so simple as to sit on the mountain side and drink a Coca-Cola? I say that because there is an answer that we have that could help to unite the entire world in "peace and harmony" so they sang. A message of God's love expressed through the filter of Jesus that is ready to be shared and received for every person that is willing to receive it. It is better than a coke and more refreshing. Love has been revealed in such a powerful way, and we have to continue to share it if we truly want to see the eternal power of peace and harmony. People do desire to find community, and Christ has provided us the ability to experience it in such a mighty way. I'd like to teach the world the REAL thing is not Coca-Cola but to sing the song that shares the fullness of love, grace and mercy... AMAZING GRACE, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me. I once was lost but now I'm found was blind but now I see. AMEN

God's Love and Ours

1 John 4:7-10

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God, because God is love. This is how God showed his love among us: he sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

C. Austin Miles, author and composer of the beloved hymn "In the Garden," believed that God's love is exemplified by the Risen Christ. When Miles was asked to write a hymn that brings "hope to the hopeless and rest for the weary," he turned in his Bible to his favorite passage, John 20, the resurrection story. Following a time of meditation focused on John's account of the resurrection of Jesus, Miles envisioned himself standing at the entrance of the garden which held the tomb where Jesus was laid to rest. In his mind he saw Mary in the garden turning to see Jesus standing before her. Miles describes his vision ending as he, "...awakened in full light, gripping his Bible." Under the inspiration of his vision, he wrote quickly as his words formed the poetry to "In the Garden," just as we know it today. Sunday, our Chancel Choir will sing Patti Drennan's exquisite arrangement of "In the Garden" and will be joined by cellist Kevin Zapata. Graceful poetry, fresh harmonies, expressive accompaniment, and a beautiful cello obligato combine to celebrate a joyous companionship experienced in the Garden with Jesus. Additionally, our early service Wesley choir will share a beautiful anthem simply titled "Prayer" by the award-winning duo; Don Besig and Nancy Price. With lyrics that focus on loving, living, praying and serving, it declares a unity in Christ and gathers us around prayer, love, and service.

"In the Garden" arr. by Patti Drennan I come to the garden alone, while the dew is still on the roses; and the voice I hear falling on my ear, the Son of God discloses. And He walks with me and He talks with me, and He tells me I am His own; And the joy we share as we tarry there, none other has ever known.


