## "Are You Ready For The Journey?"

## March 9, 2025

I have no clue what this Lenten season is going to bring to the table. I am excited, as always, to watch as God is able to open our hearts and minds to the truth that begins to be revealed when we let down our guard and provide God an avenue for direct connection into our world. As I see it, Lent should not just be a journey one time a year that causes us to focus more intently on the message God is ready to reveal, but an opportunity to change our lifestyle towards what our new norm should actually be as it pertains to our openness to God.

As we look deeper into the Wesleyan movement, we see that John Wesley viewed Lent as a time for practical divinity, prayer, fasting, and study. He believed Lent was a time of reception, not just deprivation. Wesley wanted Methodists to live out their faith in everyday life. John Wesley believed that fasting should be an integral part of our lifestyle. Lifestyle simply means a way in which an individual or group of people live. Wesley argued the more intentional we work towards our relationship with God, the more our lifestyle exhibits a desire for daily connection.

Lent should be seen as an opportunity to receive what God is wanting to give to us. Wesley argued that Lent was a time for each of us to journey with Christ through the desert and to give us a chance to fully surrender to Christ and receive that Jesus is enough. So is that true for you? Are you ready to journey through the desert and let go of all of the things that continue to keep you in a holding pattern for God's greater purpose? Surrendering is truly difficult when everything seems to be going well. Most of us would rather surrender in the times when everything is out of control because that seems to be so much easier to allow God into our world. John Wesley was adamant that we have to change this process if we truly want to live out our best purpose for which God has called us.

As I mentioned this past week in the sermon, here are some ways that I hope will help you to surrender to God during this Season of Lent:

1. Dedicate time to God every day on this journey. This time can be used in prayer or in silence. Give God an audience of your heart, mind and soul, and be prepared for the potential strength that He may give to you in return.

2. Pray for your Pastor, Staff and Lay Leadership. In this time of growth, I am asking that you pray for God to help us discern, with wisdom, the next steps to take forward as we continue to grow in our faith and connect in our community. I am asking that you dedicate 10, 15 or 20 minutes to specifically pray for Wynnton vision and our next steps.

3. Don't walk through this journey alone. Find someone who will walk with you and hold you accountable to persevere in the next 47 days and beyond. Pray that this journey of prayer becomes a lifestyle of change as God continues to awaken our hearts in 2025.

#### **JOYFUL NOTES FROM THE CHOIR!**

Charles Wesley was a prolific hymn writer. From the time of his conversion in 1738, Wesley wrote an average of two hymns a week for fifty years; between five and six thousand hymns in his lifetime. It has been said that Charles Wesley composed his hymns to bring theology to the heart, where people experience God's love in profound ways. After completing his studies at Oxford, Charles volunteered to travel to Georgia, a new colony in America, as a missionary. His experience did not go well, and he left America ill and depressed. Finding himself in a spiritual crisis, he started attending meetings led by Moravian Christian, Peter Boehler. On Sunday, May 21, 1738, Charles Wesley wrote, "I now find myself at peace with God, and rejoiced in the hope of loving Christ. I saw that by faith I stood." On Tuesday, May 23, Wesley wrote in his journal "I began a hymn upon my conversion." There is no definitive proof, but many historians believe that the hymn scripted in response to his conversion was "And Can it Be?" It is can be daunting to consider what Christ experienced before He died for our sins. The suffering He endured leading up to His crucifixion reveals the depth of His love for us. Jesus faced unimaginable pain and humiliation so that we could have eternal life. The thought of this immeasurable love can pour over you like an intense emotional wave. Perhaps, that was what Wesley experienced when he wrote "And Can it Be?" This Sunday, our Chancel Choir will sing "And Can It Be?" by composer Dan Forrest. Forrest uses Wesley's profound text combined with his own tender melody, and captures the wonder of Christ's sacrifice in a way that will touch your heart and revive your spirit! "And Can it Be?" arr. by Dan Forrest And can it be? And can it be? Amazing love, how can it be? And can it be that I should gain an interest in the Savior's blood? Died He for me who caused His pain? For me who Him to death pursued? Amazing Love! How can it be that Thou my God, shouldst die for me? He left His Father's throne above, so free, so infinite His grace; emptied Himself of all but love, and bled for Adam's helpless race; 'Tis mercy all, immense and free; for, O, my God, it found out me. No condemnation now I dread, Jesus and all in Him is mine! Alive in Him, my living Head, and clothed in righteousness divine, bold I approach th'eternal throne, and claim the crown through Christ my own. 
