"Nothing But the Blood"

Growing up in the Baptist world, I remember singing this song a lot. Now I am not saying that only Baptists understand the meaning of this song, but that it was very instrumental in helping me to shape my understanding of God's love. At a very young age, I felt the power of the Holy Spirit stirring in my heart. I remember that on a Sunday night my heart was beating so hard that I felt as if I was going to pass out. All of a sudden, the Pastor Joe B. Church (yes, that was his real name), opened an invitation for anyone who was feeling the call to come and accept Jesus as their Lord and Savior. My heart beat faster and faster, and I remember hearing in my inner ear someone telling me I needed to go. So, I did. I got out of my seat and walked down the aisle. My dad was in the pew and my mom was in the choir, and all I could think about was getting to the Pastor as fast as I could before I passed out. Pastor Joe looked at me, asked me the question, and I received Jesus as my Lord and Savior that night, never to look back or ever question my decision again. That night at Mt. Calvary Baptist Church in Valdese, North Carolina, I surrendered my life to Christ and began a journey that has truly been filled with mountain tops and pitfalls.

I wanted to share this part of my journey because I just want everyone to know that I did decide to follow Jesus and not look back. Even though I was just eight years old, I knew that God's love was a gift from God through the sacrifice of Jesus. I knew that God loved me so much that He was willing to begin a journey with me that would continue to reveal the fullness of His love in action. Many of you know that I was planning on growing up and becoming an attorney like Perry Mason. I wanted to defend people who were in dire situations and had no hope for what may come next. Then God stepped in during my Freshman year at the University of Georgia and solidified my call to ministry. I could have never imagined how this journey would unfold, but one thing was for sure, I knew that God was in control and there was nothing I could do to change that fact.

What I never realized was that my plan and God's plan had actually intertwined. You see, I thought I was going to be helping those that had lost all hope in the courtroom, but God called me to be someone to help those who had lost hope in life and eternity. God called me to grow in my love and passion for Him so that I could demonstrate the fullness of His love to others. I never imagined I would fall in love with preaching and teaching the Gospel to every person that I meet. I never imagined I would be equipped to grow in my faith to lead first, students, and now a congregation of believers who seek my guidance as we navigate this journey at Wynnton together. I never dreamed God would use a red headed, freckled faced young boy to become a pastor who relies solely on the grace, love and mercy of God to walk through each day.

You see, on that amazing Sunday night, it was "Nothing but the Blood of Jesus" that was the hymn resonating in the room; a song that reminds me that my sins are washed away and I was made whole again through the love of God represented by the blood of Jesus. All throughout this study of 1 John, I hope and pray that you too can see the impact that God has had on your life. God loves all of His creation and continues to be intentional about restoring the lives of His creation. He gave the ultimate sacrifice through His son Jesus Christ and continues to require only our obedience in return. May we truly take the time we need to push through all of the junk in this world that continues to cause us to question who we are and if we really matter. May we take hold of the fullness of God's love which teaches us that if we are still alive we matter and God has a purpose and a plan for our lives. Simply, may we live out our call to Love God, Love People and Serve Together in everything that we do.

As we continue our sermon series "Love Makes the World Go Round," I look around shopping malls, grocery stores, and markets and notice the bountiful selection of flowers, chocolates, and fluffy stuffed animals. Love is in the air! This Friday, February 14, we celebrate romance, but how often do we celebrate God's Love? Our love for each other, human love, is limited to our natural, earthly ability. God's love is unending; nothing can separate us from God's Love (Romans 8:38-39). God's Love is sacrificial; He loved us so much He sent His Son to die for us while we were still sinners (John 3:16). God's Love is unconditional (1 John 4:7-11). God's Love is powerful, dependable, reliable, and constant (Psalm 103:8-11). 
